6. See the four-face liar at Shandon Steeple and visit the Shandon Craft Centre.

8. See where Titanic made its last call - Cobh - and stop in at Cobh Cathedral.
9. Visit the oldest yacht club in the world at the RCYC in Crosshaven.
10. Take in a show at Cork Opera House.
11. Visit the Everyman Theatre in MacCurtain Street.
12. Enjoy the ambiance of Kinsale on a walking tour.
13. Take a walking tour of Spike Island.
14. Visit Bantry House and gardens in the heart of West Cork.
15. Watch a show at the Firkin Crane Theatre and stroll by the house where Jack Lynch was born.

18. Do some window shopping and have a coffee in the narrow streets of the Huguenot Quarter.

20. Visit the Quad at UCC.
21. Catch a game in Pairc Ui Chaoimh - home of the Rebels!
22. Visit Cork City Hall and marvel at the copper-domed clock tower and limestone pillars.
23. Take a stroll around the Lough and feed the birdlife there.
24. Sample some of the local brews along Barrack Street's many traditional pubs.
25. Spend a day in the sun at Fitzgerald's park and cross the shaky bridge.
26. Visit one of Cork's trendiest venues, the Bodega@St. Peter's Market.
27. Have a flutter on the dogs at Curraheen Park and enjoy a meal by the race track.
28. Visit the largest Buttermarket museum in the world and sample one of Cork's traditional exports.
29. Check out the exhibition at the Crawford Art Gallery and finish up with a bite in the Crawford café.
30. Make a trip to Gougan Bara, where it all began...the source of the River Lee.
31. Take a look at the animals in Fota Wildlife Park and take in the galleries at Fota House.
32. Learn a thing or two about the culinary arts at Ballymaloe Cookery School and House.
33. Watch Cork City's soccer team in action at Turner's Cross.
34. Look at Cork County on a micro scale at the Model Railway Village in Clonakilty.
35. Enjoy the scenery and brush up on your history at Charles Fort, Kinsale.
36. Marvel at the exotic beauty of Garnish Island in Glengarriff.
