

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUPPORT

All students are expected to have a reasonable proficiency in English to enable them to cope with English instruction in the classroom. Language support is available as tuition in small classes. All students will be assessed on arrival.

PROCEDURE FOR ENROLMENT

- 1) Complete the Application for Enrolment form available from the school or you may download it from the school website.
- 2) Send the form to Lincoln High School by fax or mail, and wait for the school to send you an Offer of Place letter.
- 3) Remit the fees to the school's bank account:

(Be sure to include the student's full name with your remittance.)
- 4) When you receive your receipt, send it and the Offer of Place letter to your nearest New Zealand Embassy or High Commission in order to apply for a student visa.
- 5) Notify the school when you receive your visa and keep the school informed of your travel arrangements.

OUR SCHOOL

Lincoln High School is a modern, co-educational high school, located in the township of Lincoln on the outskirts of Christchurch and near Lincoln University. The school is able to offer all the advantages of a city school in a pleasant and spacious environment.

The school sets very high standards for its 1560 students and offers a wide range of courses and activities. We value learning with others, individual learning and life long learning.

We welcome international students to share this educational experience with us and aim to make their time with us enjoyable and rewarding.



FACILITIES

The school has 40 specialist teaching rooms including well-equipped Science laboratories, Computer and Applied Technology laboratories, Art and Music suites, an information centre (library), three gymnasia and extensive sports grounds.

Lincoln High School is well-equipped with Information Technology. It is available to students of all levels and is used in a wide variety of subjects. The school is completely networked giving access to the Internet and library facilities throughout.

PASTORAL CARE

We believe it is very important for our students to feel at home and well cared for. The Dean of International Students is part of a team of staff who will provide ongoing personal and academic support. The school's extensive guidance and counselling network is also available to all students.

When students come to Lincoln they will be members of a 'Group' of about 40 students from Years 9 to 13. Students stay with this Group until they leave school. In the Group they will get to know students from all levels of the school. Two teachers look after the Group, each taking responsibility for about 20 students.



ACCOMMODATION

All International students at Lincoln High School will live either in a homestay arranged by the school, with their parents or a legal guardian. Homestays are carefully selected and monitored by the home stay coordinator. She is part of the pastoral care team, ensuring a warm, caring and supportive environment. Students are met at the Christchurch International airport by school staff and the host family. Flating is not permitted.
